4. Health and safety

Health aspects: These non RC papers are not hazardous to health. No personal protection is needed under recommended conditions of use.

Fire hazards: Non RC papers exhibit burning rates and hazards similar to other papers of equivalent thickness. Considerable heating above ambient conditions is required before ignition and combustion can occur. Products of combustions will depend on the burning conditions and are likely to include oxides of carbon, nitrogen and sulphur. In the event of a fire, fire-fighters should wear self-contained breathing apparatus and protective clothing.

Extinguishing media: Use water spray, carbon dioxide (CO₂) or dry powder extinguishers.

5. Waste disposal

Waste non RC papers are listed under the European Waste Catalogue (EWC) as 09 01 08 "photographic film and paper free of silver or silver compounds". They are not classified as hazardous and may be recycled along with other papers where facilities exist. If recycling is not an option these papers can be incinerated with or without energy recovery. If recovery is not possible they can be disposed of by landfill.
